Las Vegas is a virtual playground and cultural center that can provide you and your family an entertaining and fulfilling vacation while attending the NRG Conference. The activities listed here are to aid you in planning your trip to Las Vegas. The list is in no way complete, but should give you an assortment of activities to get you started with your plan. While our hotel is not located on the strip, it does however provide free scheduled shuttle service to the center of the strip. From there, there are free shuttles between the following hotels:

- Bellagio-CenterCity-Monte Carlo
- Excalibur-Luxor-Mandalay Bay
- Treasure Island-The Mirage

Also available for a slight fee are the Monorail, buses, taxies, rental bikes, rental cars, and tour buses. Plan ahead to make the best use of these. You may also want to check in room magazines for additional items and discount tickets. Your concierge is also a great source of information and for the purchase of tickets.

The Titanic: 300 artifacts plus recreations of portions of the ship at the Luxor.

Mirage Volcano: Lagoon with palm trees and waterfalls, volcano spews smoke and fire 100 ft in the air. Free 702-791-1111

Siegfried & Roy's Secret Garden and Dolphin Habitat: White Tigers and rare animal breeds in Zoological/garden setting. Located at The Mirage Hotel. Fee. 702-791-7188

The Forum Shops at Caesar's Palace: 160 shops and Restaurants featuring exclusive brands and delectable cuisine. Free

Wildlife Habitat: 15 acre tropical paradise with ducks, swans, tropical fish flamingos and pheasants all at the Flamingo hotel. Free 702-733-3349

Eiffel Tower Experience: Elevator ride to the top of the Paris hotel half scale tower. Fee 702-946-7000

Freemont Street Experience: Downtown promenade on Freemont Street. Fantastic overhead light show and music. Street level live bands, vendors and shows. Dusk till 1am. Free Zipline also available for a fee.

The Shops at Crystals: High end shopping and restaurants in an architectural masterpiece at CityCenter. 702-590-9299

Clark County Museum: A place where you can explore the rich and colorful history of Southern Nevada. The Anna Robert Parks Exhibit Hall takes the **museum** visitors through a historical journey from the Ice Age to Age of Entertainment.
